



The Role of the President of Welsh Athletics

The role of the President is that of a key ambassador of Welsh Athletics, to support the Chair, the Board of Directors and the Executive, in promoting the aims and objectives of organisation to the membership and the wider community.

The President shall be elected by the membership at the Annual General Meeting to hold office for a two-year period, after which time he shall stand down.

He will be eligible to be re-nominated and re-elected for one further term of office.

No person shall, normally, hold the role for no more than two terms.

The role is ceremonial and there is no requirement for the post holder to be involved in the decision-making process of the company, although he may serve in an advisory capacity as required.

This does not preclude the individual being involved in other capacities.

The President shall be entitled to receive the minutes of the Board of Directors, the General Council and the Athletics Committees and a list of all Welsh Athletics events to be staged throughout the year to keep up to date with issues relevant to the company.

The President shall have a seat on the General Council, in a non-voting capacity.

Duties of the President.

- To represent the company on appropriate occasions either within Welsh Athletics or beyond.
- To represent the company, if invited, at social events or meetings organised by constituent members such as clubs or regional committees.
- To present the opening address at the start of the Annual General Meeting
- To present medals and awards at major athletics events organised by Welsh Athletics.
- To meet, as appropriate, with the Chair and /or the CEO for update of information.
