The purpose of this role is to support the development and production of a new coaching learning and development curriculum to meet the aims and objectives of a new UKA coaching strategy. This will form a key part of a new high-performing and inclusive coaching system for the UK. This will help enable the sport to achieve its 3 core goals set out within Athletics Unified, the UK-wide strategy for the sport.

This is an exciting opportunity to be part of a significant change programme to better support coaches and coaching across the UK. The chosen role holder will play a key part within the Development Team in shaping the coaching strategy for the future, to ensure we create the best learning and development opportunities for coaches working at all points within the athlete pathway.
